The following are the *TSNZ Constitution and Rules* NEW & AMENDED CLAUSES as passed by Remit at the 2019 AGM.

Note that further changes including re-numbering may take place for the 1 January 2020 version of the Constitution and Rules once these clauses are included.

1) CONSTITUTION

• 1.22.1 - Anti-Doping

1.22.1. TSNZ adopts Drug-Free Sport New Zealand's Anti-Doping Rules as agreed by NZSF. The full Sports Anti-Doping Rules document is available by email on request from the TSNZ office.

• 1.G.3 - National Records

1.G.3.4 Applications must relate to a score recorded in the specific event and category being contested.

(Example) Junior Male - Air Rifle

Applications covering multiple categories with the same score shall not be considered.

- 1.G.3.5 Applications shall be considered for scores shot on single or two shot diagrams and marked electronically, or shot on electronic target systems, from the following:
 - (a) Any TSNZ Designated Match;
 - (b) Any event (including Teams Events) held as part of the TSNZ New Zealand National Outdoor Championship programme, apart from informal fun events;
 - (c) The National Championships of any ISSF affiliate;
 - (d) Any ISSF approved event.

2) INDOOR RULES

• 2.8 - Scoring Procedures

2.8.1.10 PROTEST PROCEDURES

- 2.8.1.10.1 A competitor shall have the right to have any target re-checked in order to have obvious errors corrected or doubtful shots tested. Shots that have already been tested shall not be re-tested.
- 2.8.1.10.2 Competitors are responsible for ensuring their scores are correctly recorded by the statistical office and may challenge an incorrectly recorded score.
- 2.8.1.10.3 No protests for incorrectly marked, recorded, or missing scores shall be entertained more than 10 minutes after the posting of final match scores.

• 2.11 - Competition Conditions

2.11.9.2 For PAPER TARGETS:

(iii) In twenty shot matches the two targets shall be placed adjacent, horizontally, on the target frames.

• 2.11 - Competition Conditions

2.11.1.1 Where a malfunction occurs resulting in a rifle failing to fire a projectile which exits the barrel when the trigger is pulled the competitor shall be permitted to complete the target in a later detail or squad, once the fault has been rectified. The competitor may also elect to use a substitute rifle or accessory.

• 2.12 – Postal Competitions

2.12.13 The local Association or Club shall verify the correct score has been entered on the results form and forward the scores to the Executive Officer by the date specified in the annual advertisement and shall hold shot competition targets and electronic target scoring printouts until the final results are distributed. Shot targets and electronic target scoring printouts shall be forwarded to the Executive Officer on request. Any target received in a damaged condition where the value of the shot(s) cannot be properly determined shall be declared invalid, and any score found to be incorrectly applied shall be amended. Should any target(s) or electronic scoring printout(s) be unavailable for checking by the TSNZ Executive, or examination of the targets/printouts reveal that the rules of the competition have not been followed, the competitor shall be disqualified from the competition.

• 2.13 - Inter-Island Competition

2.13.11.3 The winning Team shall hold the Cameron Family Cup for one year.

• 2.13 - Inter-Island Competition

- 2.13.13.3 The winning team shall hold the Rhodes Scroll for one year.
- 2.13.13.4 The highest scoring team member (including emergencies) from either Island team shall be awarded the Lissington Trophy for one year.

3) OUTDOOR RULES

• 3.8 - Grading of Members

3.8.16 TSNZ, Associations and Clubs reserve the right to grade a member who wishes to enter a championship but who has not yet obtained an official TSNZ grading or membership card. A currently graded indoor competitor wishing to enter an Outdoor competition without having obtained an official outdoor grading may enter as per the following schedule relating to their indoor grade obtained at the end of the indoor season immediately prior to the relevant outdoor season:

Indoor Master or A grade = Outdoor B Grade
Indoor B Grade = Outdoor C Grade
Indoor C and D Grade = Outdoor D Grade

3.11.11 - Outdoor Postals

3.11.11 The local Association or Club shall verify the correct score has been entered on the results form and forward the scores to the Executive Officer by the date specified in the annual advertisement and shall hold shot competition targets and electronic target scoring printouts until the final results are distributed. Shot targets and electronic target scoring printouts shall be forwarded to the Executive Officer on request. Any target received in a damaged condition where the value of the shot(s) cannot be properly determined shall be declared invalid, and any score found to be incorrectly applied shall be amended. Should any target(s) or electronic scoring printout(s) be unavailable for checking by the TSNZ Executive, or examination of the targets/printouts reveal that the rules of the competition have not been followed, the competitor shall be disqualified from the competition.

4) AIR RIFLE RULES

4.10 – Air Rifle Postals

4.10.11 The local Association or Club shall verify the correct score has been entered on the results form and forward the scores to the Executive Officer by the date specified in the annual advertisement and shall hold shot competition targets and electronic target scoring printouts until the final results are distributed. Shot targets and electronic target scoring printouts shall be forwarded to the Executive Officer on request. Any target received in a damaged condition where the value of the shot(s) cannot be properly determined shall be declared invalid, and any score found to be incorrectly applied shall be amended. Should any target(s) or electronic scoring printout(s) be unavailable for checking by the TSNZ Executive, or examination of the targets/printouts reveal that the rules of the competition have not been followed, the competitor shall be disqualified from the competition.
