Welcome to the delayed Insights newsletter for March. I held it back while we changed over to the new website and sorted out any teething issues. Thank you for the positive comments and suggestions, these have or are being worked on.

 grading returns received from clubs so that they will relate to the last year they
 were updated.

Jono and Helen will be conducting coaching courses in Timaru, Balclutha and Invercargill early next month. If you are in those areas talk to your club about attending as they are very experienced coaches with a wealth of knowledge that they are willing to share. One requirement is that you bring your shooter's diary or a notebook so that you can take plenty of notes.

For those that have ordered RWS ammunition, it will be available later next week, it has taken longer than expected to complete the ordering process.

Air Rifle postal matches will be starting soon. The first will be the ANZAC match with it being held over a longer period that will include 3 consecutive weekends. Details will be sent to the air rifle clubs and go on the website soon.

The Executive would like to hold this year's AGM in Christchurch over 2 days and this will be part of TSNZ's Centenary celebrations. Saturday will be for workshops, and breakout groups with invited speakers. Sunday will be the AGM. If anyone has suggestions please contact the office.

A draft Constitution is with the Executive for editing and ensuring all the requirements of the new Incorporated Societies Act are met. When that is completed it will then be sent out for consultation within TSNZ and a final version can be checked by a lawyer before being submitted as a remit for the AGM. Associations will have time to comment well before the AGM.

For Clubs and Associations that still have to do their own Constitution, Sport NZ has templates for Regional organisations and clubs and there is a template builder on the Incorporated Societies website.

The NDC draw has been completed and Alison the NDC coordinator has supplied the following article.

After a year off, we Welcome Back the Blue and Golds from Otago, and a Warm Welcome to the Eastern Jedi, both teams entering the B League this season.

Congratulations to Southland Centurions for making the leap from B League to A League. The Wellington Tigers were Promoted to Div 1 at the end of last season and the Plainsmen were relegated to Div 2.

This season we have 6 teams in each of Division 1 of A League and B League, and 5 teams in Division 2 of A League.

Div 1 and B League will have straight Round Robin matches this year, while Div 2 will have double headers to make up the correct number of matches per shooter.
