



COMPETITION RULES FOR  
TARGET SHOOTING NZ  
AIR RIFLE MONTHLY COMPETITION.  
FOR ISSF AND WSPS SHOOTERS.

## Rules

1. The matches for each round must be shot in the specified date window.
2. Matches can be shot on any appropriate shooting range subject to other rules included in this document.
3. Matches must be supervised/witnessed by an appropriate qualified person. Any person that is going to supervise/officiate will need to register as an 'official' to enable them to enter scores.
4. The supervisor must enter scores into the scoring system by the due date & time. If you have difficulties entering they can also be emailed to : [tsnzresults@gmail.com](mailto:tsnzresults@gmail.com)
5. Current ISSF, WSPS, and Target Shooting New Zealand Rules and Grading will apply.
6. All targets and score print outs must have the shooters name, signature, and date shot written on them.
7. All targets and score print outs must have the officials name and signature written on them.
8. All targets and score print outs must be retained by the official until the conclusion of the series and results are finalised.
9. All targets and score print outs may be inspected if requested by organisers.
10. Matches can be shot using either electronic or paper targets.
11. Matches shot on electronic targets will use decimal scoring. Paper targets scored with an electronic scoring machine (Disag, Rika, etc...) will be accepted as an electronic score. When electronic targets or a marking machine are not available, then using the Target Scan App will be permitted.
12. Close off time will be 5pm on the Sunday of each round. Results will be available shortly afterwards.
13. The overall series score for an individual will be the sum of their 4 highest scores across the series.
14. Mixed Pairs: The scores from the individual match go towards the mixed pairs match, and the team must shoot on the same range on the same day. Mixed teams may be from separate associations, but must shoot on the same range on the same day.
15. Where a club has an uneven number of men and women, the 'extra' may pair with one already allocated to make up another pair, Providing all other club members of the same gender are already in a pairs team. No one person may be in more than one mixed team but only if there are NO OTHER OPTIONS for pairing within the club environment.
16. Officials can also take part in the competition. However they will require someone else to officiate and enter scores for them.
17. Prize giving will be advised.
